


International Maternal & Child Health Care

- Based on the latest evidence, including Cochrane Reviews and WHO Guidelines, this textbook identifies an internationally applicable, minimum standard of care in poorly-resourced hospitals and reflects the management of problems often inherent in resource-limited countries.



The principles underlying the distribution of this book are that it should be free of charge to health workers who, and institutions which, need it most on condition that they use and look after the book in their daily work.

For health workers, hospitals and training institutions in LOW-INCOME COUNTRIES*:

- In the public sector providing free health care to children and pregnant women, each book is free of charge with no postage costs.
- In private or faith-based hospitals that charge for healthcare, each book costs £45 plus postage.
- In faith-based hospitals providing free healthcare, where the supporting charity has a total documented annual income of < £250,000, each book is free of charge (but postage will be required). For those with an annual income of > £250,000, each book is £25 plus postage.

For health workers, hospitals, training institutions in LOWER MIDDLE-INCOME COUNTRIES*:

- In the public sector providing free health care to children and pregnant women, each book is £12.50 plus postage but may be provided free of charge based on criteria available on application.
- In private or faith based hospitals that charge for healthcare, each book costs £45 plus postage.
- In faith-based hospitals providing free healthcare, where the supporting charity has a total documented annual income of < £250,000 each book is £12.50 plus postage. For those with an annual income of > £250,000, each book is £25 plus postage.

For health workers, hospitals, training institutions in UPPER-MIDDLE OR HIGH-INCOME COUNTRIES*:

- In the public sector providing free health care to children and pregnant women, each book is £45 plus postage.
- In private or faith-based hospitals which charge for healthcare, each book costs £60 plus postage.

For international medical charities:

- In low income countries or those involved in providing health care during armed conflict or other medical emergencies with a documented annual income of < £250,000, each book is £25 plus postage. For charities with an annual income of > £250,000, each book is £45 plus postage.
